

## FULL PAPER SUBMISSION – (DUE MAY 2, 2016)


Full papers are due May 2, 2016, and should be submitted through the conference administration system EasyChair. A link to the submission site can be found on the conference web site [www.nord.no/Diana2016](http://www.nord.no/Diana2016), and does also appear in the acceptance email. You will need to log into the system with the account you created when submitting the abstract.

### Submission instruction

Please read these instructions carefully to easily submit your full paper. After you log on to your EasyChair account, please access your submission from the upper left menu (Submission xx).



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You will then access the full paper submission site where your full paper can be uploaded either as a pdf or as a word file. Please note that the file should NOT include any author information. Please also follow the full paper guidelines below (next page).

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## Full Paper Guidelines

Conference papers should adhere to the following guidelines, which are similar to those for most peer-reviewed journals.

<b>Font &amp; Margins</b>	All submissions should be Times New Roman 12-pt font, double-spaced, with A4 page setting. Top and side margins should be at least one inch.
<b>Page Length</b>	The paper should be no more than 30 pages <u>inclusive</u> of references, figures and tables. (Text without figures, tables and references should not exceed 6,000 words)
<b>Title Page</b>	<p>The title page should contain the title of the manuscript and the name, position/title, affiliation, address, and telephone number of <b>each</b> author, as follows:</p> <p style="text-align: center;"> <b>TITLE OF PAPER</b>            A. Entrepreneurship Scholar (full name)            Official Title            University            University Address            Tel. --- --- ----            E-mail: <a href="mailto:soandso@university.edu">soandso@university.edu</a> </p>
<b>First Page</b>	The first page of the manuscript should contain the title of the paper, and an abstract of <b>not more than 100 words</b> (single spaced).
<b>Body Text</b>	<p>The second page of the manuscript should include the title and begin with the text of the paper.</p> <p>The manuscripts must be typed, double spaced (except for abstract) on one side of the paper only. Appropriate headings (centered) and sub-headings (left justified) should be used to segment the manuscript to enhance readability. Use bold-face for all levels of headings. First-level headings should be in all-CAPS and centered, e.g.:</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>1ST LEVEL HEADING</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Second-level headings should be left justified, no caps, bold, e.g.:</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Second-level Heading</b></p> <p>Third-level headings should be italicized and tabbed with the paragraph, e.g.:</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Third-level heading.</i></p> <p>Check that all second-level headings are preceded by a main heading, and that all third-level headings are preceded by a main and second-level heading.</p>
<b>Body Text (cont'd)</b>	
<b>Tables and Figures</b>	<p>All tables and figures (including charts and graphs) should be placed <b>at the end of the manuscript, after the references section</b>. Tables, charts, and graphs should be included only when they contribute materially to an understanding of the written presentation. They should be numbered consecutively and placed at the end of the manuscript. Within the body of the manuscript, indicate the placement of each table or figure. For example, if table one should be placed on page five between paragraphs two and three, indicate this by a centered callout:</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>"Insert Table 1 Here"</i></p>
<b>Footnotes</b>	Please use footnotes, not endnotes. Additionally, footnotes should be used <b>only</b> for clarification that is not appropriate for the body of the manuscript. They should be numbered consecutively, married at the appropriate place in the text, but listed under the heading Footnotes, at the end of the manuscript.
<b>References</b>	Please make citations according to the latest edition of the "Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association" using author's(s) last name(s), year of publication, and, when quoting, the page numbers. All publications cited in the text should be <i>listed alphabetically by first author's last name in the References section (double-spaced) at the end of the paper.</i>
