Nord University's quick guide to Open Access (OA) publishing

Nord's OA policy (PDF) (applies to **all researchers** at Nord) and funders like <u>the Research Council of</u> Norway, the EU and Northern Norway Regional Health Authority demand Open Access (OA) to research publications, and <u>Plan S</u> (01.01.2021 \rightarrow) entails new requirements in this regard. There are many different ways of achieving <u>Open Access for scholarly publications</u>. The OA Team at the University Library can assist with the following three:

1. Publishing in pure OA journals (Gold OA)

- ✓ Are you affiliated to Nord University and the corresponding author of the publication?
- ✓ Is the journal listed in <u>DOAJ</u> and <u>ranked by HK-dir</u> on levels 1 or 2?
- ✓ Is your article peer-reviewed and has it been accepted for publication?

If the answers to **all** these questions are yes, you may be granted financial support from the University's <u>Open Access Fund</u>. All you need to do is fill in and submit the <u>application form</u>.

Please note: All those receiving funding are obliged to upload the published version of their article via Cristin for subsequent archiving in the university's institutional repository, <u>Nord</u> <u>Open Research Archive</u> (see no. 3 Self-archiving of publications...).

2. Publishing via national journal agreements

- ✓ Check if your chosen journal is included in one of the <u>national journal agreements</u> in which the university participates (see lists of included journals for each publisher)
- ✓ There are two types of agreements:

Publish and read agreements

- These cover Article Processing Charges (APCs) in full → free publishing
- Publishers: Elsevier and Sage (subscription-based journals only), Association of Computing Machinery, Cambridge University Press, Springer Nature, Taylor & Francis & Wiley
- The agreement with Taylor & Francis has limitation in OA publishing due to an annual quota

Discount agreements

- These give **discounts** on publishing fees -> fees may be covered via OA Fund!
- Publishers: Frontiers, Elsevier, Sage and Springer Nature (pure OA journals). Please <u>send an</u> <u>application</u>!
- The agreement with Emerald only applies to subscription-based journals, and researchers must cover the fees using their **own funds**
- ✓ Follow the instructions of the publisher in question as outlined on <u>our website</u>
- ✓ Your article will be made OA automatically upon publication

3. Self-archiving of publications in institutional repository (green OA)

- ✓ If options 1 and 2 are not feasible, you can achieve OA through <u>self-archiving</u> of the Author's Accepted Manuscript (AAM) version
- ✓ Search for your journal in <u>Sherpa Romeo</u> to see which article version may be archived
- ✓ Upload your article via Cristin. The OA Team will authorise rights before archiving the article in the institutional repository, <u>Nord Open Research Archive</u>
