

PhD conference at Nord University, PhD in Science of Professions, Faculty of Education and Arts, and Faculty of Nursing and Health Science

The PhD conference is an annual event which seeks to bring PhD candidates together and network across the broad diversity of scientific fields within the PhD in Sciences of Professions at Nord University.

The conference is arranged by the Interdisciplinary Development Forum (TUF) for PhD-candidates. It takes place in the spring semester every year from lunch one day to lunch the next day.

The event will be a chance for the candidates to present and discuss their research to peers and other participants. The event also offers the chance for the candidate to act as co-chair during the presentations, giving the opportunity to get experience with acting as a scientific panel member in a conference.

Every year, a prominent scholar in the scientific society will be invited to give a lecture. In addition, we invite PhD candidates to join the prize competition for best flash talk, best poster and for best oral presentation on the award ceremony on the second day at lunch. In the evening the conference participants are invited to join an informal dinner.

All PhD candidates are expected to submit an abstract based on their PhD-project for the event at least once during their enrolment. The presentations in the format of flash talks, posters or oral presentations should include a short discussion of how the project relates to Science of Professions, focusing on language, relations and actions.

- First year candidates are invited to submit abstracts and give a flash talk
- Second year candidates are requested to submit abstracts and give a poster presentation.
- Third- and fourth-year candidates are requested to submit an abstract and participate as cochair or by giving an oral presentation.

Deadline for submitting abstracts and submission procedure and necessary templates will be available at the website for the PhD programme.
