

Call for abstract

PhD conference: PhD in Science of professions, 25 and 26 March, 2026

Abstracts submitted in English will be included in the electronic abstract book that will be published on the PhD conference webpage.

Please note that the abstract will be published as received by the committee, so you must ensure that you do the language editing yourself. Please write your abstract in clear and precise language:

- Formatted in Word, font Times New Roman 12, single spaced, left margin 3 cm., top, right and bottom 2 cm, paper size A4. Convert to .pdf and name document before submission.
- Document name must include last name of first author followed by first few words of the abstract title
- The maximum length for the abstract title is 150 characters (including spaces), and the title should be in lowercase letters except for the first letter, proper nouns, and acronyms.
- The abstract body (Background and aims, Methods, Results/Main contribution, Conclusions, Implications, and any References) should be no longer than 300 words.
- Abstract som ikke følger Abstract guidelines vil bli sendt i retur for justering.

Please note that tables and figures are not allowed (save them to your oral/visual presentation).

Subheadings should be as follows:

Title:

List of (all) authors and their affiliations: First author and the presenter should be the PhD candidate. Please do only include authors' names and affiliations (i.e. no academic degrees or professional titles).

Background and aims: Describe the background or motivation of the study or experiment and state the aims and objectives of the study, including the possible research questions and hypotheses.

Methods: Describe the design, data (e.g., participants [if relevant] and relevant participant details such as for example age, developmental stage, severity of for example diagnosis, disorder, or disability), data collection and materials employed, and describe how you have analysed or explored the data.

Results and main contribution: Outline the results and outcomes.

Conclusions: State the basic conclusions of the study.

Implications: Discuss implications for a) future research, b) the sciences of professions focusing on language, relations, and/or actions and c) professional practice.

References (optional): Provide up to maximum three key references.

Authors will be notified about program details on the conference webpage. Please note that only the submitting first author/presenter, i.e. the PhD candidate of the abstract is automatically registered for the conference.
