

Pitch talk

PhD conference: PhD in Science of professions, 25 and 26 March, 2026

First-year PhD students are invited to submit an abstract and prepare an electronic poster and give a 2.5-minute pitch talk.

All sessions aim to contain both pitches, flash talks and oral presentations, with one senior chair and one or two co-chairs. Session number and presentation order will be available by searching your name in the abstract book.

The pitch talk is based on a pre-prepared electronic poster.

Electronic posters or E-Posters are similar to traditional paper posters but displayed on-site on a large LED TV screen or a large auditorium LED screen.

How to do a pitch talk

Based on your abstract and the pre-prepared electronic poster showing simultaneously on the auditorium LED screen, the pitch talk should be in English and should take no more than 2.5 minutes. After your presentation, there will be 4,5 minutes for feedback and questions. The time limit will be strictly enforced by the chairs.

The content of the Flash talk should be understandable to non-specialists. The presentation should include an introduction to your anticipated PhD project and a brief discussion of how the project relates to Science of Professions with focus on language, relationships, or actions.

Feedback

After your presentation, there will be 4,5 minutes for feedback and questions. The chairs will among other things consider the following:

- Is your talk comprehensible to people outside your research area?
- Is your poster easy to read and understand and does it support your pitch talk?
- Are your aims and hypotheses clear?
- Is it clear how the project relates to Science of Professions with focus on language, relationships, or actions.
